# Romance scams

### **Definition of romance scam**

A romance scam is the extortion of money and property through a fake emotional and romantic relationship initiated virtually by a scam artist.

## **STRATEGY**

#### The scammer:

- Makes contact with the victim via social networks or dating sites using a fake profile.
- Sends a message with a first name that doesn't match, or supposedly official documents containing spelling mistakes.
- Identifies themselves as being of high social status, prestigious, charismatic or in a position of authority.
- Proposes to continue communicating via other means, outside the dating site, using a private or different communication method (e-mail, text messaging, WhatsApp, Google Hangouts, etc.).
- Is travelling or living abroad, but would like to come visit you.
- Always finds good reasons or excuses for not meeting by camera or in person.
- Once they've established trust with you, they'll bring up unusual financial difficulties
  to ask for money: a blocked account at a financial institution, a stolen cell phone or
  computer, illness of a loved one, trouble with the law, an accident, etc.
- The amounts of money requested are minimal at the start, and gradually increase over time.

If you refuse to provide money, threats and intimidation will often be used to coerce payment.

## **PREVENTION TIPS**

- Stay alert on the various dating sites or social networks
- **Be wary** if someone initiates the first contact
- If you have any doubts, check it out with someone you trust
- **Never transfer** money or assets to someone you only know <u>virtually</u>
- Keep your conversations on **official platforms**
- Don't make your bank account accessible to your love interest to make financial transactions
